#### Still learning!

As many of you will know, my first proper job was as a junior doctor. Having completed my undergraduate training I became what was known then as a 'houseman'. Although I was qualified, and was referred to as 'Dr Barton', my authority was limited and I had to work through the next year of ongoing training under the authority of my consultant before I could be formally 'registered' with the General Medical Council.

My latest 'job', as curate, shares similarities. Having completed my training as an ordinand with South West Ministerial Training College, I was ordained last September as a 'deacon' in Exeter Cathedral. Whilst this meant that I could be referred to as 'Rev' Paul, my authority has been limited, and I have had to work through this last 12 months under the guidance of John. Last month Bishop Robert authorized my ordination to become a priest and on Saturday 26th of September I will be (or will *have* been if you are reading this in October!) 'priested' by the Bishop of Plymouth.

In much the same way that I have had to continue my studies in medicine up to the present time (and show evidence of my continuing development), so too will I continue my theological studies into the future.

I am very aware of my 'journey', from lying in my pram as a baby outside the church in London, via baptism, confirmation and marriage, all the way to the present time.

We are all on a journey of faith and we are all at different points on that journey, which will not be completed until the moment we die. How much we shape our route and how much we allow ourselves to drift is up to each one of us. It will be influenced by the people we meet, the conversations we have, the books we read and the television we watch. As Jesus was preparing himself and his disciples to go up to Jerusalem, to the trial and crucifixion he knew lay ahead, he continued to prepare them for the ongoing journey that they would continue after his death, working to build God's kingdom through time and space, reaching down to the 21st century in Wellswood. Our journey links to theirs, and our role is to continue to work to bring his kingdom to those near to us.

God wants us to hear his voice, to choose to follow his path, to know his will, and allow all of this to shape our route. As a priest my tasks will include helping you on that journey through encouragement and teaching, through prayer and counsel.

Some have thought that this service on the 26<sup>th</sup> will signal my posting to pastures anew, but rest assured I am staying here at St Matthias for the next part of my journey and I very much am looking forward to sharing a part of your journey over the next few months and years.

For the first week in the Summer Holidays we went to Elevate. Elevate is a day camp based in a church in Torbay that lasts a week and is organised by



the Christian youth group LiNX. During this week we did lots of different activities and games and went on trips. There were 75 teenagers aged twelve to sixteen from around Torbay and we had fun, made new friends and thought more about life alongside youth workers from churches across Torbay. On the first day we were put into different teams for the week. In our teams we had to earn as many points as possible over the week to try and win. We then went to 'Rock Solid' (where we played games and did activities to try and win points). We then had our workshops, which we had already chosen to sign up to. We did cooking and it was great and we got to eat what we had made. After lunch we did a team Treasure Trail around Torquay, it was really exciting and competitive. On Tuesday we went to the River Dart Country Park, where we swam in the lake and went on the low ropes and zip-wire. To finish off the day we had a barbeque and played 'Capture the flag' and football. Tuesday was a really great day to meet other people and have fun.

On Wednesday we spent the whole day at Woodlands, a theme park near Totnes. We had an amazing time on all the rides and played in the indoor play-area. We even got Ruth and another youth leader to go on the pirate ship! On Thursday we had a choice to either go to Quaywest, a swimming pool with water slides, or the cinema. We went to the cinema and it was really good. We saw 'Inside Out'. Some of my friends went to Quaywest and they said it was great!

On Friday we had our Big Choice. We could choose from; Battlefield Live, Combat Archery, Coasteering, Horse-riding or Dry Slope skiing. We did the Dry Slope skiing and although I was tired afterwards, I found it amazing. If you had never skied before or weren't a confident skier you went into a different group where you were taught to ski. At the start there were only three confident skiers who were allowed down the big ski slope or on the ski lift. By the end all of us had used the ski lift and gone down the big slope. After our big choice we went back to the church where we had the Grand Finale and Prom. We dressed up as people from films to earn ourselves more points so our team dressed up as James Bond characters. We had dominoes ice-cream and pizza for dinner! At the end the points were revealed and our team came third! The loosing team leader was gunged and it was Ruth! Our team were all really happy and although we came third we all agreed it didn't matter because we had an amazing time. Elevate was really fun and we would definitely recommend it to anyone. # UNDER CONSTRUCTION CONTENT WILL BE AVAILABLE SOON

## The Building reordering - where have we got to?

As this magazine goes to press, the church planning authorities (the 'Diocesan Advisory Committee' or 'DAC') are meeting at St Matthias' to take a first look at some draft proposals for reordering the church.

We hope to have an initial reply from them about the *likelihood* of permission being granted by the end of October. But we also have to consult other interested parties, e.g. The Victorian Society and English Heritage! So, it is unlikely to be before Christmas that we can come back to the church family to share what is likely to be possible, let alone with Godly wisdom affordable! Having said that, the PCC met for an Away Day on 6<sup>th</sup> September, and fully and unanimously endorsed the proposed plans so far.

Key features of the proposals are to:

- **Redesign the West end of the church**, to improve accessibility, a more welcoming entrance, a larger space at the back of the church and provide the storage we so badly need, and a small kitchenette.
- **Replace existing seating to improve comfort and layout of the church** to allow wheelchairs/pushchairs better access, and allow the more informal services like Prayzone to work in the church as they do in the Hall. (By the way, should Prayzone move into the church, we do not plan to stop the current Morning Praise service as some have feared! (though we may have to review the best times that these services start)).
- **Upgrade audio-visual provision in the church** we know that the sound system is not right but that is because of the equipment and not the fault of our faithful sound people!

Glass in Francis Chapel and be able to use that better as a prayer chapel We'd love to find a way to hold smaller services in the beautiful Chancel

**once again** but the layout and comfort of the choir stalls does not allow this at present.

We'll keep providing updates to progress on these plans. Please keep praying for the project (we're going to hold afternoon prayer meetings on every 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday now). And finally, the PCC are very clear that we remember that the building is just a means to an end – we're here to **worship God**, to **make disciples**, and to work with the Lord to **transform communities** – our own church family here and beyond, so that they more resemble the shape of the Kingdom of God. *Yours in Christ, John*

#### YOUTH UPDATE



It's been a busy time since the last update. Back in June, four of the young people, Ben and Grace Vans-Colina and Matthew and Charlotte Dickinson, and Lisa Tulloch and I, were confirmed by Bishop Robert. It was a really special time, and great to see these four young people, who had worked through Youth Alpha/Confirmation classes with John and me, want to confirm their faith and proclaim it as their own. It's one of the joys and privileges that I have as youth worker is to be involved in young people finding God for themselves. Please pray for these young people, that the promises that they made will continue to be true, and for all of the young people who are on their own faith journeys. Schools broke up for the summer and the holidays started. All of the youth activities take a break over summer as a lot of people like to go away. It did give some of us the chance to go to Elevate, the annual youth activities week that is run by LiNX Christian Youth Trust. There were approximately 70 young people from across Torbay and beyond who came together at Upton Vale Baptist church for the first week of the summer holidays, including three of our young people. It was an exciting week as you will read but from my point of view I was a team leader again and with a young leader we led 8 young people through a week of quizzes, silly activities, thought provoking talks and discussions and a wide range of workshops and activities, all the while trying to earn team points so that I wouldn't get gunged during the week!
