Readings for Christmas Day

John 1 1-14

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was with God in the beginning. ³ Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. ⁴ In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

⁶ There was a man sent from God whose name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. ⁸ He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.

⁹ The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. ¹⁰ He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognise him. ¹¹ He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. ¹² Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God – ¹³ children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God. ¹⁴ The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

Numbers 6: 22 - end

²² The LORD said to Moses, ²³ 'Tell Aaron and his sons, "This is how you are to bless the Israelites. Say to them:

24 ""The LORD bless you

and keep you;

²⁵ the LORD make his face shine on you and be gracious to you;

²⁶ the LORD turn his face towards you and give you peace.'"

²⁷ 'So they will put my name on the Israelites, and I will bless them.'

Luke 2: 15-21

¹⁵ When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, 'Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about.'

¹⁶ So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. ¹⁷ When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, ¹⁸ and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. ¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. ²⁰ The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told. ²¹ On the eighth day, when it was time to circumcise the child, he was named Jesus, the name the angel had given him before he was conceived.

'A Miracle in a Bowl' Christmas Collection We are continuing our usual custom of giving away the cash collection at our 10.30am Christmas morning service this year. The charity we are supporting is Tearfund's child feeding programme in Burundi. How many children could we feed?



"Even before the conflict Burundi was the third poorest country on earth. Now people are facing a rise in food prices, a lack of availability and little knowledge of

nutrition. Christmas will come and pass – there will be a reason to celebrate, but nothing to celebrate with. As part of our Therapeutic Feeding Programme, Tearfund is working with local nutritionists, educating people to prepare affordable, nourishing meals like porridge."
