## Readings

#### Isaiah 55: 6-12

<sup>8</sup> 'For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways,' declares the LORD.
<sup>9</sup> 'As the heavens are higher than the earth,

so are my ways higher than your ways

and my thoughts than your thoughts.

<sup>10</sup> As the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return to it without watering the earth and making it bud and flourish,

so that it yields seed for the sower and bread for the eater, <sup>11</sup> so is my word that goes out from my mouth:

it will not return to me empty,

but will accomplish what I desire

and achieve the purpose for which I sent it. <sup>12</sup> You will go out in joy and be led forth in peace; the mountains and hills will burst into song before you, and all the trees of the field will clap their hands.

#### Luke 8: 1-15

After this, Jesus travelled about from one town and village to another, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom of God...

<sup>4</sup>While a large crowd was gathering and people were coming to Jesus from town after town, he told this parable: <sup>5</sup> 'A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path; it was trampled on, and the birds ate it up. <sup>6</sup> Some fell on rocky ground, and when it came up, the plants withered because they had no moisture.<sup>7</sup> Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up with it and choked the plants. <sup>8</sup> Still other seed fell on good soil. It came up and yielded a crop, a hundred times more than was sown.'

When he said this, he called out, 'Whoever has ears to hear, let them hear.' <sup>9</sup> His disciples asked him what this parable meant. <sup>10</sup> He said, 'The knowledge of the secrets of the kingdom of God has been given to you, but to others I speak in parables, so that,

"though seeing, they may not see; though hearing, they may not understand." <sup>11</sup> 'This is the meaning of the parable: the seed is the word of God.<sup>12</sup> Those along the path are the ones who hear, and then the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts, so that they may not believe and be saved. <sup>13</sup> Those on the rocky ground are the ones who receive the word with joy when they hear it, but they have no root. They believe for a while, but in the time of testing they fall away. <sup>14</sup> The seed that fell among thorns stands for those who hear, but as they go on their way they are choked by life's worries, riches and pleasures, and they do not mature. <sup>15</sup> But the seed on good soil stands for those with a noble and good heart, who hear the word, retain it, and by persevering produce a crop.

## Growing on the journey

Looking at the 2016 figures, we find, thank God, that St Matthias is still growing in number! There are now 225 adults and over 50 children who come regularly – that's a net growth of about 5% from last year. But with growth, comes the responsibility to ensure we pay for the clergy – here at St Matts



and for the Diocesan advisors, and to help support less well-off churches in Devon. So, in addition to paying for the practical running costs of St Matts (which were £380 a year per adult 'member' last year), we are asked to contribute a further £435 to the staffing costs. In all, that's around £60 per month depending on whether or not it is gift aided. That's a lot of money we know. God also knows that some are able to give more than others, and the biblical principle is that we give in proportion to our income – so we are grateful for any contribution you can make. Last year, we had to dip into our reserves to cover these costs, so please think and pray about whether God is calling you to give more.
