Readings

Genesis 42:1-13, a summary of chapters 43 and 44, and 45:1-7

42 When Jacob learned that there was grain in Egypt, he said to his sons, 'Why do you just keep looking at each other?' ² He continued, 'I have heard that there is grain in Egypt. Go down there and buy some for us, so that we may live and not die.'

³ Then ten of Joseph's brothers went down to buy grain from Egypt. ⁴ But Jacob did not send Benjamin, Joseph's brother, with the others, because he was afraid that harm might come to him. ⁵ So Israel's sons were among those who went to buy grain, for there was famine in the land of Canaan also.

⁶ Now Joseph was the governor of the land, the person who sold grain to all its people. So when Joseph's brothers arrived, they bowed down to him with their faces to the ground. ⁷ As soon as Joseph saw his brothers, he recognised them, but he pretended to be a stranger and spoke harshly to them. 'Where do you come from?' he asked.

'From the land of Canaan,' they replied, 'to buy food.'

⁸ Although Joseph recognised his brothers, they did not recognise him. ⁹ Then he remembered his dreams about them and said to them, 'You are spies! You have come to see where our land is unprotected.'

¹⁰ 'No, my lord,' they answered. 'Your servants have come to buy food. ¹¹ We are all the sons of one man. Your servants are honest men, not spies.'

¹² 'No!' he said to them. 'You have come to see where our land is unprotected.'
¹³ But they replied, 'Your servants were twelve brothers, the sons of one man, who lives in the land of Canaan. The youngest is now with our father, and one is no more.'

Joseph goes on to test his brothers by insisting that one brother remained hostage in Egypt, while the others returned home to fetch Benjamin. To their dismay and confusion, on the way back, they discovered that Joseph had put the silver they had paid for the grain back in their own sacks...

Not wishing to grieve their father further, they did not return with Benjamin immediately, but upon running out of food, they knew that they had to do so. This time, they took double the amount of silver they needed, and other gifts, and travelled to stand in fear before Joseph once more – who they still did not recognise.

This time, Joseph's trick was to hide his own silver cup and the silver they had paid for the grain with in Benjamin's sack. Then he sent his steward after them, and accused them of stealing, so that terrified, they were all brought before him

again. They pleaded for mercy for their own sake and for their elderly father Jacob's sake...

45 Then Joseph could no longer control himself before all his attendants, and he cried out, 'Make everyone leave my presence!' So there was no one with Joseph when he made himself known to his brothers. ² And he wept so loudly that the Egyptians heard him, and Pharaoh's household heard about it. ³ Joseph said to his brothers, 'I am Joseph! Is my father still living?' But his brothers were not able to answer him, because they were terrified at his presence.

⁴ Then Joseph said to his brothers, 'Come close to me.' When they had done so, he said, 'I am your brother Joseph, the one you sold into Egypt! ⁵ And now, do not be distressed and do not be angry with yourselves for selling me here, because it was to save lives that God sent me ahead of you. ⁶ For two years now there has been famine in the land, and for the next five years there will be no ploughing and reaping. ⁷ But God sent me ahead of you to preserve for you a remnant on earth and to save your lives by a great deliverance.^[a]

Matthew 28:16-20

¹⁶ Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. ¹⁷ When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted. ¹⁸ Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.'
