Gospel Reading

Matthew 6:25-33

²⁵ 'Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? ²⁶ Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? ²⁷ Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?

²⁸ 'And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labour or spin. ²⁹ Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendour was dressed like one of these. ³⁰ If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you – you of little faith? ³¹ So do not worry, saying, "What shall we eat?" or "What shall we drink?" or "What shall we wear?" ³² For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. ³³ But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

Introduction to the Baptism

Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me. Do not stop them'. We thank God for Louis who has come to be baptized today. Christ loves him and welcomes him into his Church. So I ask you all:

Will you support Louis as he begins his journey of faith? We will.

Will you help him to live and grow within God's family? We will.

The minister then addresses the parents and godparents:

Will you pray for him, and help him to follow Christ? We will.

The Decision

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore I ask:

Do you turn to Christ? (which means trusting him as Lord) I turn to Christ.

A time of confession follows

Do you repent of your sins? (the things that separate us from God and neighbour) I repent of my sins.

Do you renounce evil? I renounce evil.

We receive God's forgiveness

We affirm our faith

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist? I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again? I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world? I believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith. We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Baptism

Louis, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The sign of the cross is made on the forehead, saying Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.

Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ against sin, the world and the devil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen.**

Living on One World – Do you have a LOW footprint lifestyle?

How many Worlds would be needed to sustain the global population if everyone on the planet lived like you? Find out your ecological footprint by simply answering the following questions...

ENERGY: The majority of the energy you use is likely to

come from burning fossil fuels, which release carbon dioxide (CO2). Assuming this is the case, you must start this section with a score of 6 points...

• Does your electricity come from a renewable source, such as wind turbines? If so, subtract 1 point.

• Do you burn peat or logs as an energy source in your home? If so, subtract 1 point.

• Do you set your thermostat low? Is your home well insulated? Do you have double-glazed windows? And do you only turn the heating on when absolutely necessary rather than keeping it on timer all year? If yes to at least 2 of these, subtract 2 points.

FOOD

- Do you follow a vegan or vegetarian diet? If so, score 4 points.
- Or only eat meat occasionally? If so, score 7 points.
- Or eat meat usually? If so, score 8 points.
- Or eat meat with every meal? If so, score 10 points.

TRANSPORT: Do you travel:

- Usually by car? If so, score 3 points.
- Sometimes by car? If so, score 2 points.
- Mostly by public transport? If so, score 1 point.
- Mostly by walking and/or cycling? If so, score 0 points.

HOLIDAY: When you last went on holiday, did you:

- Holiday close to home? If so, score 1 point.
- Holiday in Europe, or take a short flight? If so, score 2 points.
- Take a long flight to get away? If so, score 6 points.

MATERIALS & WASTE: The consumption of material goods and the production of waste is normally the largest part of a European ecological footprint. Choose one option from each side of the grid overleaf to derive your score:

SCORES:



Less than 11: Excellent! You are Living on One World – a truly LOW footprint lifestyle. If everyone lived like you, then human and non-human existence could be sustainable and equitable. About 69% of the world's population have an

ecological footprint in this range.



12-20: Well done, you are close to having a LOW footprint lifestyle. Even so, if everyone lived like you, we would still need more than one planet to sustain us. About 14% of the world's population have a

footprint in this range.



20-40: Your ecological footprint is close to or above the European average. If everyone lived liked you, we would need 2 or 3 additional planets to

sustain us. About 12% of the world's population have an ecological footprint in this range.



40-50: Your ecological footprint is close to the North American average. If everyone on the

planet lived like you, we would need 3 or 4 additional planets to sustain us. About 5% of the world's population have a footprint in this range.
