Readings for Today

Psalm 5:1-8

- ¹Listen to my words, LORD, consider my lament.
- ² Hear my cry for help, my King and my God, for to you I pray.
- In the morning, LORD, you hear my voice; in the morning I lay my requests before you and wait expectantly.
- ⁴ For you are not a God who is pleased with wickedness; with you, evil people are not welcome.
- ⁵ The arrogant cannot stand in your presence.

You hate all who do wrong;

- ⁶ you destroy those who tell lies.
 - The bloodthirsty and deceitful you, LORD, detest.
- ⁷ But I, by your great love, can come into your house; in reverence I bow down towards your holy temple.
- ⁸ Lead me, LORD, in your righteousness because of my enemies make your way straight before me.

Micah 4:1-4

- ⁴ In the last days the mountain of the LORD's temple will be established as the highest of the mountains; it will be exalted above the hills, and peoples will stream to it.
- ² Many nations will come and say, 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the temple of the God of Jacob.

He will teach us his ways, so that we may walk in his paths.'

The law will go out from Zion, the word of the LORD from Jerusalem.

³ He will judge between many peoples and will settle disputes for strong nations far and wide.

They will beat their swords into ploughshares and their spears into pruning hooks.

Nation will not take up sword against nation, nor will they train for war any more.

⁴ Everyone will sit under their own vine and under their own fig-tree, and no one will make them afraid, for the LORD Almighty has spoken.

Hebrews 9:24-28

²⁴ For Christ did not enter a sanctuary made with human hands that was only a copy of the true one; he entered heaven itself, now to appear for us in God's presence. ²⁵ Nor did he enter heaven to offer himself again and again, the way the high priest enters the Most Holy Place every year with blood that is not his own. ²⁶ Otherwise Christ would have had to suffer many times since the creation of the world. But he has appeared once for all at the culmination of the ages to do away with sin by the sacrifice of himself. ²⁷ Just as people are destined to die once, and after that to face judgment, ²⁸ so Christ was sacrificed once to take away the sins of many; and he will appear a second time, not to bear sin, but to bring salvation to those who are waiting for him.

Matthew 5:43-48

⁴³ 'You have heard that it was said, "Love your neighbour and hate your enemy." ⁴⁴ But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, ⁴⁵ that you may be children of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. ⁴⁶ If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that? ⁴⁷ And if you greet only your own people, what are you doing more than others? Do not even pagans do that? ⁴⁸ Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect.
