Our new preaching series on Philippians

Paul would have a special sympathy for our Covid 19 lockdown since he was writing from a jail cell! You might think that would make this letter dark and sad but in fact Philippians is the most joyful and happy of all his letters. The word 'joy' occurs over 16 times and we are repeatedly encouraged to rejoice.

So, what will we learn from this letter which we can apply to our unusual times? Firstly, we will find an encouragement to pray – and to pray with thanksgiving. Secondly, we will discover how God turns around a devastating difficult situation (being in prison) to being a wonderful opportunity for witness to the gospel. Thirdly, we will be inspired by Christ's example to be humble, patient and obedient when we are under pressure. Maybe the most telling parallel with our situation is when Paul considers his own death. You see, a fear of death underlies much of our thinking since the pandemic began. But what does Paul make of this? He says "For me to live is Christ and to die is gain". In other words, Paul faces both life and death with confidence and assurance.

But is this letter all high-minded stuff? No, it is practical too! He tells us "I have learnt the secret of being content" (very useful in lockdown!) and "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (handy when faced with the challenge of unfamiliar technology!) Finally, there is a great promise: "My God will meet all your needs according to his glorious riches in Christ Jesus". Join us in this new series on Sundays! Andrew Green

Sun	Some of us understand technology, others of us don't! Thank God for those who do and are able to bring us virtual worship. Pray for them as they prepare services and meetings for us. Pray they have vision and understanding as they put things together.

When will the church open again?

We still don't know - so watch this space!

It looks as though we are now allowed to open the church 'for private prayer' from 13th June – however, we will not be opening

immediately. The PCC discuss the issue on 15th June and we are collating other information to assist us in our decisions. For example, we await responses from the survey we have sent out about who might act as stewards and also need to consider whether the church might be used by some hirers from July, since the capacity of any of our rooms and halls is substantially reduced with the 2m distancing and sanitising requirements. We are also looking towards opening on Sundays for some acts of worship as and when the government rules allow us to.
