New Look Wednesday 9am Services June 2021

We're planning to re-start the midweek Communion services from 9th June.

While we learn to manage the logistics of livestreaming both the 9.30am and 11.00am, and so as to provide for both the midweek Communion congregation and a temporary 'home' for the Sunday 8am Prayer Book Communion congregation as best we can, we plan to hold the usual Common Worship Communion on 1st, 3rd and 5th weeks and use the Prayer Book words on 2nd and 4th Wednesdays.

At present, we are still not able to congregate after any service to chat, and face coverings will still be mandatory, however we hope that as these restrictions are lifted, we would then be able to stay on for coffee and a chat after the Wednesday morning service – even if we have to bring our own coffee in a flask!

Rev Mark Lord-Lear and Rev Brian and Norma Gerry have kindly agreed to host these services along with Paul and John, (though on occasion the Communion may have to be replaced with a Morning Prayer). So, from Wednesday 9th June, do come along at 9am for Holy Communion together.

News of Archbishop Josiah Idowu-Fearon

Josiah has been linked with St Matthias' for many years. He is currently based at Lambeth Palace as the Secretary-General of the Anglican Communion Worldwide and is working on preparations for next year's Lambeth Conference of Anglican bishops. After that has been held Josiah plans to return to Kaduna, Northern Nigeria to re-engage in his peace-making activities, seeking to improve understanding between the Christian and Muslim communities. Sadly Josiah's house in Kaduna has recently been burnt down (due to careless bush burning by a local worker) and with it his theological library of between 6500 and 7000 volumes on both Christian and Muslim subjects. The library had been passed by Josiah to the Kaduna Centre which works for understanding and peace between the two communities. Prayer is requested for Josiah and his family and, if anyone wishes to make a contribution towards the restoration of house and library, Ian Lane ('phone 01803 607345) can give guidance on how this may be done. He has checked with the Revd Peter Larkin – while studying in Birmingham Josiah served with Peter as a curate in Bromsgrove - that the facts are correct (ie not a Nigerian scam using Josiah's name) and that insurance is not a viable option in Northern Nigeria.

Brief notes of the Annual Vestry Meeting and Annual Parochial Church Meeting held by Zoom on Sunday, 18th October 2020 (yet to be approved)

Present: Rev'd John Beckett (Chairman), 8 church members in church and 44 online

The Annual Vestry Meeting opened with prayer.

Apologies for absence received from Rob & Sue Newman, & Graeme & Penny Whitaker.

Sylvia Barratt and Paul Stannard were appointed as Churchwardens. Thanks were expressed to Sylvia & Paul (& their spouses) for their service over the past 18 months.

Sue Davies, Giles Fearnley. Andrew Stilliard and David Wilkinson were appointed to serve on Deanery Synod for a period of 3 years.

Tessa Barton, Jill McDowall, Sue Newman, Elaine Wilson and Suzy Wright were appointed to serve on the PCC for a period of 3 years and **Tony Barratt** for 2 years (replacing Marilyn Smee who has resigned and who was thanked for her service).

Smarter Accounting was appointed as Independent Examiner and Penny Whitaker as **Electoral Roll Officer.**

It was proposed that a Reader licensed to the parish be appointed to the PCC

The **Annual Report** has been made available online and as hard copies. The Secretary reported that first part covers 2019 and 2020 up to the time of the publication of the report whilst the second part was a financial report on the year to 31st Dec 2019. At the time of the 2019 APCM the electoral roll was 216. Whilst under revision 3 names were added; in addition 5 have moved away and sadly 7 were deceased. There were now 207 on roll.

The Treasurer reviewed the **Financial Report**. Referring to the Operating Income & Expenditure Summary (Page F11), compared to the previous year Church income had increased by £9300 but Church Centre and Pre-School income had decreased by £5k and £16k respectively. 85% of voluntary giving was through the PGS and the Treasurer expressed his appreciation for those giving through the scheme. The Church Centre hiring had taken a hit but Pre-School numbers were on the rise. One challenge that we faced was a Common Fund payment of nearly £100k. Commenting on 2020, he went on to say that the circumstances were unprecedented. So far, voluntary income was down by 16% and Church Centre income by 40%. Maintenance costs were thankfully lower. In the coming months we would seek to address the shortfall in Centre income.

In conclusion the Treasurer thanked the banking team, Alan for his support with Wellspring, Sylvia for dealing with the statutory accounts, Smarter Accounting and everyone for their faithful giving.

Regarding the completion of payment for the Wellspring project, he explained that we were expecting VAT recovery of £75-100k which, with an expected legacy, would cover the repayment of an interest-free loan. The PCC had discussed this and agreed that we would absorb any shortfall within our reserves, which would have to be replenished. A question was raised requesting specific accounting details for the Wellspring project. John B explained that the project was a fixed price contract (with any extras agreed by the PCC) following a competitive tendering process. Due to a difficult online connection John asked for any specific questions to be emailed. The meeting recorded a vote of thanks to Tony and Alan. Sue Davies was thanked for all that she did in her role as Safeguarding Officer.

- in addition to the Annual Report there was discussion of the Report of Groups
- were there plans to engage an organist? Tony and Lindsay were happy to cover
- did the meeting need to approve the accounts? this was a PCC responsibility, following the report from the independent examiner
- thanks were expressed to everyone involved in Wellspring

John Beckett gave an address that was available online <u>Rectors Report at 2020APCM - YouTube</u>. John and Ruth were thanked for their hard work – everyone else too – and the meeting closed with prayer.
