# Readings

#### .Job 19:20-27

- <sup>20</sup> I am nothing but skin and bones; I have escaped only by the skin of my teeth.
- <sup>21</sup> 'Have pity on me, my friends, have pity for the hand of God has struck me.
- <sup>22</sup> Why do you pursue me as God does? Will you never get enough of my flesh?
- <sup>23</sup> 'Oh, that my words were recorded, that they were written on a scroll,
- <sup>24</sup> that they were inscribed with an iron tool on lead, or engraved in rock for ever!
- <sup>25</sup> I know that my redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand on the earth.
- <sup>26</sup> And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God;
- <sup>27</sup> I myself will see him with my own eyes I, and not another. How my heart yearns within me!

### 2 Thessalonians 2:1-5, 13-17

Concerning the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our being gathered to him, we ask you, brothers and sisters, <sup>2</sup> not to become easily unsettled or alarmed by the teaching allegedly from us – whether by a prophecy or by word of mouth or by letter – asserting that the day of the Lord has already come. <sup>3</sup> Don't let anyone deceive you in any way, for that day will not come until the rebellion occurs and the man of lawlessness is revealed, the man doomed to destruction. <sup>4</sup> He will oppose and will exalt himself over everything that is called God or is worshipped, so that he sets himself up in God's temple, proclaiming himself to be God. <sup>5</sup> Don't you remember that when I was with you I used to tell you these things?

<sup>13</sup> But we ought always to thank God for you, brothers and sisters loved by the Lord, because God chose you as firstfruits to be saved through the sanctifying work of the Spirit and through belief in the truth. <sup>14</sup> He called you to this through our gospel, that you might share in the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ.

<sup>15</sup> So then, brothers and sisters, stand firm and hold fast to the teachings we passed on to you, whether by word of mouth or by letter.

<sup>16</sup> May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who loved us and by his grace gave us eternal encouragement and good hope, <sup>17</sup> encourage your hearts and strengthen you in every good deed and word.

### Remembrance: Submarine E4 Lost on 15th August 1916

The memorial tablet placed on the north wall of the church by Harry Dundee Hooper records the loss of his wife, daughter and son, all within a period of 19 months. His son, Stewart Briscoe Dundee Hooper, was a Royal Navy Lieutenant on board submarine E4 which was exercising off Harwich. His submarine was diving when it collided with another submarine, E41, which had surfaced. Both submarines sank, in the case of E4 with the loss of all 32 members of the crew and in the case of E41 with the loss of half of its personnel. They were interred at nearby St Mary's, Shotley.

It is thought that a total of around 74 British submarines were lost during WW1. Just a little more information than the memorial supplies but worthy of our remembrance.
